HOW WILL WE LIVE TOGETHER?

SHE: *ALAE AND NATHALIE*





As a Lebanese-born American artist and mother, my crosscultural experiences inform my art. I have dedicated my work to exploring issues of personal and collective identity through photographs of female adolescence and womanhood—both in the United States, where I live, and in the Middle East, where I am from. I am interested in what it means to be a girl and a woman in a world that poses endless questions of girls and women of all backgrounds.

My work addresses states of "becoming"—the fraught beauty and the vulnerability of growing up—in the context of our visceral relationships to our physical environment and universal humanity. It is also about collaboration, experimentation, performance, empowerment, and pushing the limits of creativity and self-expression—both for the young women I work with and for myself.

I have recently started collaborating with two twentyyear-old women who seemingly had nothing in common between each other: Alae, a Shia Muslim woman from Southern Lebanon, and Nathalie, a Jewish woman from Weston, Massachusetts. Whereas their lives and backgrounds are very different, they are both college students at similar stages of their young lives and are alike in more ways than one could imagine, especially in their love of art and the artistic process. Our collaboration became regular and intense, and extended to different locations and seasons, with each bringing her own creativity to the process. I eventually found myself developing a similar and parallel collaborative relationship with each of them, and introduced them virtually to each other on Instagram. They instantly connected and we started a back-and-forth collaborative artistic relationship across continents, which coincided with my own trips between Lebanon and the United States. Each photographic encounter with one would elicit a photographic response from the other and so on, as I shared the images with them and acted as the visual "messenger."

By collaborating with these two young women, one in the United States and one in the Middle East, I am focusing on our essence, our physicality, and the commonalities that make us human, ultimately highlighting how female subjectivity develops in parallel forms across cultural lines. In the Rania Matar was born and raised in Lebanon and moved to the US in 1984. Matar received a 2018 Guggenheim Fellowship, 2017 Mellon Foundation artist-inresidency grant, 2011 Legacy Award at the Griffin Museum of Photography, and 2011 and 2007 Massachusetts Cultural Council artist fellowships. She has published four books: SHE (Radius Books, 2021). L'Enfant-Femme (Damiani Editore, 2016), A Girl and Her Room (Umbrage Editions, 2012), and Ordinary Lives (Quantuck Lane Press, 2009). She is associate professor of photography at the Massachusetts College of Art and Design.

divisive world we live in today, I hope that these images and this unlikely collaboration between two beautiful young women of very different backgrounds can reveal the delicate and multilayered beauty in our shared humanity—in the universal as well as personal experience of young women encountering the challenges of growing up regardless of background, culture, and religion.
